Scripture: Matthew 5:20

Title: Obtaining Righteousness

Same "Old" Standard

Matthew 5:19

In our culture that often says

Do your own thing

You can't legislate morality

Where we often question authority And nobody can tell me what to do...

These verses tells us we still have to follow the law Jesus isn't changing it We need to obey even the little things

He has told us God's word is supreme It hasn't changed and won't change

Jesus is the King, the King of all

He is establishing His kingdom

But, it is a spiritual kingdom

...an internal kingdom

He is talking about a new character starting from the inside

The key to this new kingdom is the OT

Righteousness is still defined in God's terms
He hasn't changed His mind, on anything

This Law, God's law is over the rabbinic traditions
It is God's Word that stands
Not the traditions of the rabbis
Not the traditions of any man

The Bible doesn't make suggestions
Rather it gives commands
We can't minimize even the least of these

Jesus has fulfilled some of these laws – they are no longer binding

The moral laws are still in effect

If we break the law we're least If we keep it we're greatest

1 Thessalonians 4:7

7 For God has not called us for the purpose of impurity, but in sanctification.

The moral law is still to be followed

It is related to God's character

He is holy, we need to be too

In the Epistles we see this again and again Clarifying what Jesus has taught here

Colossians 2:14

Jesus paid the penalty for our sin on the cross

Paid it in full – took care of it, cancelled it out

The penalty was paid in full

We are no longer under the curse of the Law

We have seen in verses 17-19

God's law is supreme – there is no greater

Past, present or future

It is true, always has been true, always will be true

Jesus came to show us this

He did not come to start over

To wipe out the law

Rather to fulfill it

B/c of this God's Law is to be followed

Down to the smallest part

Purpose of the Law

Then we come to verse 20

Matthew 5:20

What is the purpose of the law then?

The purpose of the law is to show us that we need more righteousness than we can come up w/ on our own

Galatians 3:24

The Law was given for the purpose of frustrating us
To show us our inadequacy

The Law was given not to show how good we are – rather how rotten we are

Several things to consider...

What kind of people do you think go to heaven?

Good people, right?

The better we are, the greater our chance...

Right?

Let's look at Luke 18:9-14

This parable is about 2 men

One of them was very religious

Tithed on everything he had

Fasted 103 more times every year than

was required

He was a religious leader

The other man was not religious

Worked for the evil Roman government

Stole/swindled from his country men

Got rich off the poor

By our above standard which of these men would be righteous – good enough to go to heaven

Interesting – it's the bad guy that is made righteous – and the "good" guy...

In order for us to be righteous, made right w/ God We need s. more than the Scribes and Pharisees of the day, we need s. more than being "good" or religious

Scribes and Pharisees

Two groups often spoken of in Jesus' day
Scribes – copied the Law
Often very liberal
Didn't believe in resurrection
And...Pharisees – strict adherents of Law, separatists
Didn't want to be defiled by anyone or

Knew they couldn't keep the standard of the OT Came up w/ their own list, their own traditions

These took the place of God's standard

anything

This is what the world does – it knows we can't keep, or meet, God's standard

So, make up our own so we can be "OK"

Tithe everything – down to the smallest vegetable
Fast more than other people
Be religious
Today...do good
Be nice, do good things...

Make your own standard b/c you know you can't keep God's

Most people of this day looking at Scribes and Pharisees figured they were the righteous ones, the good ones, the ones going to heaven

> They knew they couldn't do what they did Follow the law so closely

But Jesus said – that isn't good enough

Their deeds don't make them righteous

The Scribes and Pharisees were dependent on what they had done, it was an external thing

> Theirs was an outward observance of the Law They could maintain the outside The inside was a mess

> > They hated, condemned Had impure thoughts, and Cold hearts toward God

Theirs was an external system

Based on traditions of men

God's system is internal, a matter of a changed heart

Again – what's the greatest commandment?

Love the Lord your God...

This is internal, this is relationship, not standards

Matthew 23:2-3

Do what they say, not what they do...
They do all their deeds to be noticed by men

Mark 7:7-8

Over time they had abandoned the law of God
They had created their own law
And convinced themselves they were spiritual

Theirs was a self-centered righteousness

Based on their own standard

They left God out, didn't need Him

Not only does our righteousness have to be greater than the Scribes and Pharisees

> Most important – it has to meet God's standard Absolute perfection Absolute holiness Internal and external righteousness

Obtaining righteousness

How good to we have to be to get into heaven? Be as good as God – perfect

Now – how are you all doing w/ that? Sounds impossible...

Maybe we better go back to making up our own set of rules

Galatians 2:16

We are justified by faith in Jesus We are made righteous by faith in Jesus

We cannot get God's righteousness by our own effort By following the Law

We can't do it of our selves

Romans 3:21-22

Righteousness of God comes by faith in Jesus Believing that He died for us

We can't earn this, it is God's gift to us

If we try and gain it ourselves we are lost

We can reach out and take God's gift by faith in the

Lord Jesus

Listen to this verse...Romans 8:4

4 so that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us

By putting our faith in the Lord Jesus
Repenting and trusting Him as our Savior
The requirement of the Law is fulfilled in us

When God looks at us, those of us who have repented and trusted Jesus as our Savior...

He sees us righteous

He sees us holy
He sees us perfect
Think on that for a while, a long while...

W/o Jesus being God come in human flesh
W/o His death in our place
His substitutionary atonement
W/o His resurrection
There is no attainable righteous for you and I

It doesn't matter how good we are, how religious we are - w/o Jesus we can never be righteous

God has set the standard

We can argue all we want Doesn't change the standard He is the standard

Greatest thing of all – He made the way for us to meet His standard – through His Son, His death in our place

Conclusion:

I'd like us to end with a little test today
A test to see if we are good or bad
Simple test – no studying necessary
Going to start w/ God's standard of the 10
commandments
1 – Have no other gods
How are you doing there?

Anything get in your way of loving and serving God? Anything taking up more time in your life than your relationship w/ God? Anything more important than God in your life?

2 – Don't take God's name in vain

How about that one?

Ever use God's name in a way not referring to Him, not honoring to Him...

We're skipping around a bit Don't want/need to hit them all...

3 – How are you doing at honoring your parents?

Maybe you're grown – does that let you off the hook – how did you do at home?

Did you go to bed when asked?

Do what you were asked?

Respond respectfully...

4 - Do not lie

Maybe we should just skip that one...
Anyone here never lie?

5 – Do not steal

Maybe nothing big...

I don't see anything qualifying this one

Do not steal big things...

Do not steal things over \$5.00...

How is it going so far?
We've only hit 5 of the 10
We could keep going
I think you get the point

We often like to think we're good enough Like to think we're better Good enough

By God's standard, by God's Law
None of us is righteous
All of us have sinned
All of us are separated from God

What does our verse say again?
We need a righteousness greater than the Scribes and the Pharisees

What kind of a righteousness did they have?

Self righteousness – they were right in their own eyes – thought they were good enough

The righteousness that we are to have is not available under the present system

No matter how good we are, how kind we are How religious we are...

We cannot enter the kingdom on our own goodness No matter how good it may look...

The standard is the Old Testament, the Law of God None of us measure up None of us can

We need to repent, ask Jesus' forgiveness – believe in Him, but our faith in His death and resurrection Have His righteousness applied to our lives Believe in Him

Philippians 3:7-8a, 9

7 But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ. 8 More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord,... 9 and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,
